# Wintertide An Advent Liturgy

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All scripture from the English Standard Version.

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Advent is a special time. It gives us the opportunity to focus on the beautiful and often unintentionally lost blessings of the Christmas Season. These blessings come to us through community, family, generosity, tradition, reflection, anticipation and finally celebration. Advent brings intention in a season of chaos and impulsivity.

While many of us have good intentions for the Christmas season, we often find ourselves overwhelmed, and come to the end of the holidays feeling empty and unfulfilled. I don't know about you, but I find that the structure of Advent, its *pre*scription, is keenly effective at re-centering me back on the coming of God in the form of Man, and that a 2000 year old story, full of wonder and lunacy, still has the power to change how I live out my life in relationship with my fellow sojourners of this cold, wintry world. Here's the thing about Advent, though... you can't just visit it a couple of times before Christmas. Or at least I can't. Material distractions and social expectations creep in from all directions. How was I to fight this? Eventually, I settled on the idea of a liturgy, which literally means 'work for the people'. A daily work. A habit. That's what was needed.

And so here is Wintertide: An Advent Liturgy. Along with three original songs, you will find a daily guide for celebrating Advent in a liturgical fashion. There is the large, more robust liturgy, meant for Sundays or other community Advent services. The other days of week make use of the abbreviated liturgy setting, with the intention of being practiced at home or in small groups. My family made it a habit at supper last year, and my two year old became very attached to the music and the candle lighting each night. My desire is to help bring the joy of Advent to you in an easily accessible format, to help you step back from the chaos and re-connect with the things that make Christmas so special – Christ, family, community.

#### Day 1

#### **Reading** – John 1:1-5

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our hope shine His light into our lives this day, this week, and this season. May it overcome every darkness. Go in hope to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 2

#### Reading – John 1:9-14

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

**Benediction** - And now may we make room in our hearts to receive the God of our hope this day, this week, and this season. May we see His glory as He comes to dwell among us. Go in hope to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 3

#### Reading – Psalm 43:3-5

Send out your light and your truth; let them lead me; let them bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling!

Then I will go to the altar of God, to God my exceeding joy, and I will praise you with the lyre, O God, my God.

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

**Benediction** - And now, O God of our hope, may we be led by Your light and truth this day, this week, and this season. Though there be turmoil without and within, may our hearts yet praise You. Go in hope to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 4

#### **Reading** – Isaiah 2:2-5

It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, and many peoples shall come, and say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore.

O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

**Benediction** - And now, may the God of our hope teach us His ways of peace and justice this day, this week, and this season. May we walk together in His light. Go in hope to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 5

Reading – Isaiah 60:19-22

The sun shall be no more your light by day, nor for brightness shall the moon

give you light;
but the Lord will be your everlasting light,
and your God will be your glory.
Your sun shall no more go down,
nor your moon withdraw itself;
for the Lord will be your everlasting light,
and your days of mourning shall be ended.
Your people shall all be righteous;
they shall possess the land forever,
the branch of my planting, the work of my hands,
that I might be glorified.
The least one shall become a clan,
and the smallest one a mighty nation;
I am the Lord;
in its time I will hasten it.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our hope be at work in our lives for His glory this day, this week, and this season. May you be encompassed by His everlasting light. Go in hope to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 6

#### Reading – Isaiah 64:1-9

Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil to make your name known to your adversaries, and that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome things that we did not look for, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From of old no one has heard or perceived by the ear, no eve has seen a God besides you, who acts for those who wait for him. You meet him who joyfully works righteousness, those who remember you in your ways. Behold, you were angry, and we sinned; in our sins we have been a long time, and shall we be saved? We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls upon your name,

who rouses himself to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have made us melt in the hand of our iniquities.

But now, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.
Be not so terribly angry, O Lord, and remember not iniquity forever.
Behold, please look, we are all your people.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our hope display His awesome name in ways unlooked for this day, this week, and this season. Though we are unclean and withering, may we take a hold of You and remember Your ways. Go in hope to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 7

#### **Reading** – Isaiah 52:6-10

Therefore my people shall know my name. In that day they shall know that it is I who speak; here I am."

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the Lord to Zion. Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the Lord has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. The Lord has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

**Benediction** - And now may we eagerly watch for the God of our hope this day, this week, and this season. May we see the dawning of the day at the end of the long night. Go in hope to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 8

**Reading** – 2 Samuel 7:8-16

Now, therefore, thus you shall say to my servant David, 'Thus says the Lord of hosts, I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, that you should be prince over my people Israel. And I have been with you wherever you went and have cut off all your enemies from before you. And I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may dwell in their own place and be disturbed no more. And violent men shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel. And I will give you rest from all your enemies.

Moreover, the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son. When he commits iniquity, I will discipline him with the rod of men, with the stripes of the sons of men, but my steadfast love will not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away from before you. And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever.'

**Benediction** - And now as we wait for the revealing of His plan may the God of our faith strengthen us this day, this week and this season. May we have a vision that spans the generations. Go in faith to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 9

Reading – Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end,
on the throne of David and over his kingdom,
to establish it and to uphold it
with justice and with righteousness
from this time forth and forevermore.
The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our faith shine light on injustices that we may be a part of the building of His Kingdom this day, this week and this season. May our righteousness be established not in our own deeds but in the forgiveness of our sins. Go in faith to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 10

#### **Reading** – Isaiah 11:1-10

There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.

And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.

And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins.

The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them.

The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra,

The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den.

They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain;

for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples—of him shall the nations inquire, and his resting place shall be glorious.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our faith bring about His coming vision of justice and harmony through our lives this day, this week and this season. May we share in the knowledge of the Lord. Go in faith to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 11

#### **Reading** – Isaiah 40:1-5

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries:

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our faith find us in our winding valleys and our precipitous mountain passes this day, this week and this season. May He set us upon His path; though it lead through the desert, it shall lead us to His glory. Go in faith to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 12

#### Reading – Isaiah 60:1-3

Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will be seen upon you. And nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our faith be with us in the darkness this day, this week and this season. May His presence allow us to illuminate the gloom which threatens to overwhelm. Go in faith to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 13

**Reading** – Isaiah 61:1-4, 9, 11

The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to grant to those who mourn in Zion to give them a beautiful headdress instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit; that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that he may be glorified. They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.

Their offspring shall be known among the nations, and their descendants in the midst of the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge them, that they are an offspring the Lord has blessed.

For as the earth brings forth its sprouts, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to sprout up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to sprout up before all the nations.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our faith free us this day, this week and this season from that in our lives which we cling to and imprisons us. Though the ground outside is dormant, may our lives

be a fertile garden of righteousness and praise. Go in faith to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 14

Reading – Micah 5:2, 4-5a

But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days.

And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God.

And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth.

And he shall be their peace.

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our faith show us the unexpected, the overlooked, the forgotten in our lives this day, this week and this season. May those of us who feel that way more often than not know that we too have a vital role to play in His story. Go in faith to love and serve the Lord.

## Week 3 - Joy

#### Day 15

**Reading** – Luke 1:5-17

In the days of Herod, king of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, of the division of Abijah. And he had a wife from the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. And they were both righteous before God, walking blamelessly in all the commandments and statutes of the Lord. But they had no child, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were advanced in years.

Now while he was serving as priest before God when his division was on duty, according to the custom of the priesthood, he was chosen by lot to enter the temple of the Lord and burn incense. And the whole multitude of the people were praying outside at the hour of incense. And there appeared to him an angel of the Lord standing on the right side of the altar of incense. And Zechariah was troubled when he saw him, and fear fell upon him. But the angel said to him,

"Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great before the Lord. And he must not drink wine or strong drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb. And he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God, and he will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to make ready for the Lord a people prepared."

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our joy surprise us with the unexpected answer to our divinely orchestrated desires this day, this week and this season. May we be a people prepared and ever turning to the Lord. Go in joy to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 16

#### Reading – Luke 1:18-25

And Zechariah said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years." And the angel answered him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news. And behold, you will be silent and unable to speak until the day that these things take place, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time." And the people were waiting for Zechariah, and they were wondering at his delay in the temple. And when he came out, he was unable to speak to them, and they realized that he had seen a vision in the temple. And he kept making signs to them and remained mute. And when his time of service was ended, he went to his home.

After these days his wife Elizabeth conceived, and for five months she kept herself hidden, saying, "Thus the Lord has done for me in the days when he looked on me, to take away my reproach among people."

**Benediction** - And now may the God of our joy be at work in the impossible of our lives this day, this week and this season. Where once we have been barren, may we bear fruit for His kingdom. Go in joy to love and serve the Lord.

#### Day 17

## Reading – Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

## **Reading** – Luke 1:39-45

In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."

#### Mark 13:33-37




#### Isaiah 35:1-6
